

# MOVIO

MOVIO is a tool for the creation of digital exhibitions. It helps curators to build stories using their digital collections in a new way, creating thematic paths by using different types of media or content. MOVIO allows very simple to quite in-depth navigation so that the richness of an exhibition can be fully covered online.

## MOVIO manual pages

1. [Introduction to the MOVIO back-end](#)  
This manual provides a brief overview of the general functionalities of the MOVIO back end.
2. [Customisation of MOVIO template](#)  
The default MOVIO template can be customised in terms of structure, font and colours.
3. [Multilingualism in various MOVIO components](#)  
In different aspects of the MOVIO tool, multilingualism is possible.
4. [Management of user and group roles](#)  
This module allows the management of personal data (name, surname, e-mail, etc.) and the credentials of users who may have access to the back end and front end of a MOVIO instance. It also contains information on tailoring your exhibition's content to different user groups.
5. [The WYSIWYG text editor](#)  
WYSIWYG is an acronym that stands for 'What You See Is What You Get'. In MOVIO, a WYSIWYG editor allows you to edit the text content on web pages similarly to using a normal word processing application.
6. [The ontology builder](#)  
An alternative semantic way of structuring the information in MOVIO.
7. [The media archive](#)  
The Media Archive is the section in MOVIO where multimedia objects, used in e.g. a virtual exhibition, are managed within the system.
8. [The different MOVIO Page Types](#)  
Click to see the overview of the dedicated manuals for each MOVIO Page Type. A Page Type in MOVIO is the preset structure in which you add new content to construct an individual MOVIO page (e.g. Timeline, Photogallery, ...). The Page Type manuals are listed in alphabetical order.
9. [The Europeana Connector via API](#)  
MOVIO includes the possibility to add related content from Europeana to your exhibition, using the implemented Europeana API.
10. [The APP Generator](#)  
Generate your mobile version of MOVIO via the App Generator.
11. [The Module Builder](#)  
The Module Builder allows you to create your own database in the back-end of the exhibition. You can generate dedicated pages, based on the database data, to display the information in the front end.
12. [The MOVIO Hub](#)  
MOVIO-Hub is a catalogue of existing MOVIO exhibitions. This tutorial teaches you how to connect yours.
13. [Social sharing buttons](#)  
Instructions on how and where to enable sharing buttons for social networks within your exhibition.
